The goal of Rural Week is to enhance medical students' awareness of the rewards and challenges of rural practice, and to encourage them to consider a career in rural medicine. This experience may be their first taste of rural life. It lets them enjoy life in a small town, and discover its many benefits. One hundred and ten (110) students are participating throughout the province this year.

Our students will spend time with the Hamiota health care team, visit the High School to discuss their career choice in medicine, & visit the Decker Colony. Host families were Red & Ruth McConnell and Val Doupe. Dr. Karen Juce introduced the students before the supper that was provided at the Hamiota Golf Course. The Mid-West Arts Council Annual Meeting was held on May 25, 2011 at the Heritage Arts Centre. Tom Mollard, chairperson called the 2010 Annual Meeting to order. Minutes were read and approved and the Annual Report adopted as circulated. Amendments were made to the Arts Council's by-laws. An election took place with Heather Rothnie elected as President, and Irene Todd accepted the Vice President position. Kevin Routledge was appointed as the auditor for 2010-11. Tom Mollard was thanked for his two years as President of the Arts Council.

Following the adjournment of the meeting, Irene Todd made a presentation which involved a discussion of the article *The Importance of Arts in a Community* by Craig Johnson followed by the video *Learning for Life: Why the Arts Matter*. The focus was the idea that the arts provide more than just entertainment and beautification to a community. Johnson stated that the arts contribute to personal development, daring us to know ourselves by challenging, inspiring and changing us. Through an increased self-awareness and a belief in our own ability to create, the arts lead to creative, forward-thinking change – a necessary component of any thriving community. The video's message was similar, showing the many skills learned by participation in artistic activities, confidence, self-awareness, team work, peer appreciation, creative thinking, & improved academic performance. 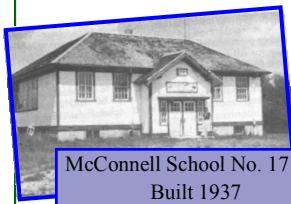

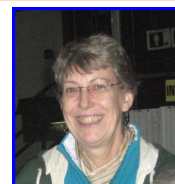
