### OUR HISTORY.....OUR VISION

Hamiota "A Progressive Community"

Located in the rich agricultural area of south western Manitoba, Hamiota and the surrounding areas have developed a strong base for industrial and commercial growth.

Residents embrace the easy going lifestyle of rural living, while enjoying the many amenities often found only in larger centres.

### Hamiota District Health Centre

"An Integrated Health Care System"

Health Care for Hamiota and area evolved from a small cottage hospital in 1904 to the construction of the Hamiota and District Hospital in 1950



and the eventual adoption of the **Community Health Care Model** in 1974. Over thirty years this model has proven to be sustainable and innovative in meeting the community needs.

### Hamiota District Health Centre

"An Integrated Health Care System"

The original partners who shared the vision of community health care included the Town of Hamiota and the Rural Municipalities of Blanchard, Hamiota, Miniota, and Woodworth.

As one of the first fully accredited hospitals of it's size, the centre continued to push the boundaries of conventional "health" and adopted a system which better suited the district. The health centre has worked on and made innovative improvements to the model for the past thirty five years.



The model's success can be attributed to:

- \* Cooperation through true team work and a common vision of excellence
- \* All services are coordinated under one roof and one governance
- \* A fully integrated team of salaried physicians and nurse practitioners.
- \* Equal importance and voice given to all health care staff and volunteers

### Services and Facilities

Hamiota District Hospital contains 20 acute care beds for children and adults.

Services include the following:

- \* Primary Care Services
- \* 24 Hour ER & Outpatient
- \* Diagnostic (X-Ray, Lab, ECG)
- \* Chemotherapy
- \* Palliative Care
- \* EMS Services
- \* Undergraduate Physician Training and Postgraduate Family Physician Training .....(these programs have always been affiliated with the University of Manitoba)



### Community Health Services:

- \* Mental Health
- \* Home Care
- \* Public Health
- \* Baby First Program
- \* 30 units Personal Care Housing (PCH in the *Birch Residence*)

## Hamiota Medical Clinic

\* Five Family Physicians provide a full range of primary care services, including acute illness care, checkups and disease screening.

\* Physicians have ongoing communication with specialists and will arrange consultation.

\* There is a visiting Podiatrist.

\* Dental Clinic with 6 operatories and 2 dentists provides full dental services.

\* Phototherapy unit, which is the only one available in Manitoba outside of Winnipeg.

\* **NEW** “Telehealth” service (using television) for doctor/patient communication with specialists in Winnipeg and other locations without leaving Hamiota.



## Elderly Persons Housing

“Safe, Affordable Housing”

The provision of safe and affordable housing is important to people in the community.

The *Park Residence* and the *Lilac Residence*

provides individuals with the opportunity to retain their independence with their own suite. There are 60 units for Elderly Persons Housing (EPH)



A full time Recreation Facilities Director provides services including entertainment and recreational events. This is all part of helping to keep mind, spirit, and bodies active and healthy.

## Outreach Services

“Reflective of the Community Health Care Approach”

Outreach Services compliment the primary health care services and add to the breadth of the community health care model. Those services are fully integrated into the system. They include: Mental Health, Public Health, Home Care, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy, Dietitian, Family Service Workers, Volunteer Service (which includes Pastoral Care / Health Auxiliary / and Palliative Care Volunteers

Additional organizations which work cooperatively with the Hamiota District Health Centre also includes:

Hamiota Seniors Council Inc.—Support Services, TOPS (Take Off Pounds Sensibly), Addictions Foundation of Manitoba, Alanon, Alcoholics Anonymous

cross-country skiing in winter.



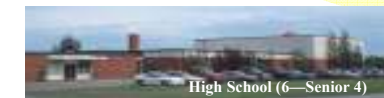
## Education K to 12
